Dear Xavier Family-

I recently read an article from the Cardinal Newman Society, an organization dedicated to the promotion of Catholic education, bemoaning the “crisis in Catholic Schools.” Critical of the optimistic tone of a recent report from the Nation Catholic Education Association, the article suggests that we are in dire straits. Enrollments numbers are trending down, especially in the Midwest and Northeast. Baptisms and Confirmations continue to decline. The authors take a subtle jab at Catholic schools while praising the homeschool families and independent Catholic schools which are not necessarily included in the NCEA report. Now, every parent has to make a decision about what’s best for their particular child and many of these other schools are doing good work, but if there is a crisis in Catholic schools today, it is not from the lack of “genuine Catholic identity” which the article asserts. If there is a crisis, it is because we spend too much time talking about Catholic theology and not enough time showing the world what a Catholic life should look like.

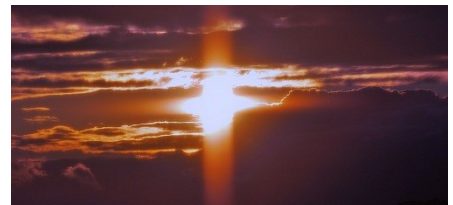
Ask your Xavier student about the theology of transubstantiation and you’ll likely be impressed. Xavier students know that the Immaculate Conception is about when Mary was conceived in her mother’s womb, not when Jesus was conceived in Mary’s womb. They can tell you the conditions for a mortal sin, explain the causes of the Reformation and Catholic counter-reformation, and probably speak to the classifications of angels and the notion of purgatory. They are well-catechized. In our annual test of Catholic knowledge for the juniors, our students score far beyond the national average for young Catholics, significantly better than those in other Catholic schools and overwhelmingly better than those who have not been blessed with a Catholic education. It’s Catholic Schools Week – we should make sure that we recognize the sacramental graces that come from regular participation in the Mass and the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the ability to defend one’s faith that comes with being well-taught in Catholic theology. So if Catholic schools like ours are facing declining enrollments, perhaps the Cardinal Newman Society is looking under the wrong rocks for answers.

The earliest Catholics weren’t known for their theology. They did not win converts by claiming a corner on the market of truth. They impressed their neighbors and brought other into community by being generous. Early Catholics were famous for their treatment of the widows, the poor and the outcasts. In short, they made people want to be a part of their community because of their abundance of love. For centuries, saintly Catholics have followed similar paths – serve those in need and always act with love. Worry less about why a person is an outcast and more about how to love them. Go to places where others are afraid to go and serve those in greatest need. This is where our students and families can really evangelize. You may not knock on doors with Catechism in hand, but do you care for your elderly neighbor or take the time to volunteer at the food pantry? Our students live the mission of the Church by traveling around the country building houses, cleaning up after hurricanes, and bringing joy to young children in everyday ways. It is in our service that we most resemble the love of Jesus. They’ll know Him first through our hands, and only later by our mouths.

So on this yearly celebration of Catholic education, let’s make a new goal for our Xavier family – let’s love better, reach out more, bring joy to our communities. St. Francis Xavier is one of the Church’s greatest missionaries. He baptized thousands. His success was based on the love he showed for each community he visited and the willingness of his fellow Jesuits to serve in whatever way was needed. Let’s make people come and check out Xavier because their students seem so generous, so supportive of one another and of all. Let’s be a Catholic school in the most genuine sense of the word – by loving all like Jesus did. There will be plenty of time for talking about Jesus once we bring others into relationship with us. When the world gets to know Xavier by our actions and our service, there will certainly be no crisis in this Catholic school.

World Language Honor Societies

French, German and Spanish students may be eligible for membership in one or more of our world language honor societies. To qualify academically, students must be sophomores or older and have completed three terms of their language at Xavier. Their grade point average in the language must be at least 3.5, with no grade lower than a B.

In addition to the academic requirements, new members must earn a minimum of six service/social/cultural-activity points by the end of third term. Continuing members must continue to maintain the 3.5 grade point average in the language and earn eight points each year. The most popular ways to earn points have been by preparing and serving international meals for family and/or friends, hosting international students, viewing international films, and tutoring students who are struggling with language learning.

There are many other opportunities to earn points. The complete list is included on the application for membership, which may be obtained from any world language teacher. The deadline for applying for membership, either as a new or a continuing member, is Tuesday, March 19th.

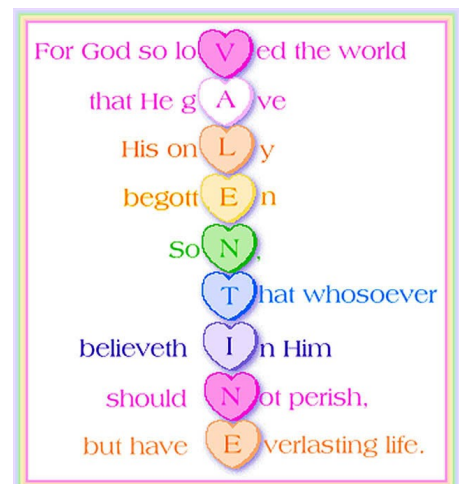

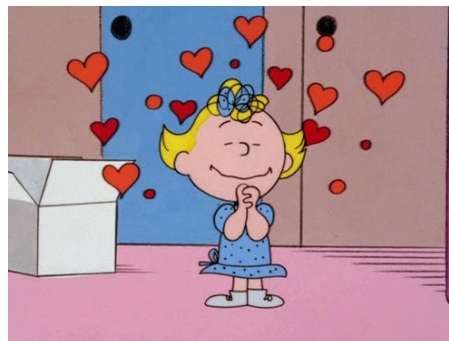
