That's something to be proud of, and it reflects a drive which will serve them well in their next endeavors.

It is a tribute to them as individuals and to their class that they arrived here in such style and with such a list of accomplishments.

As our seniors join the prestigious community of Xavier alumni, join me in holding them in prayer. May the relentless spirit of St. Francis Xavier be enkindled in them, that the same courage and passion by which he lived may be seen in each of them. May the faithfulness of Mary our Mother and the trust in God of Joseph, her husband, inspire each of them to greater faith and trust in the Lord. May they live Jesus in their hearts forever. As much as we are sad to see them go, we rejoice in the promise of what God has in store for them. Congratulations to the Class of 2024!

Senior Celebrations and Events

SENIOR AWARDS CEREMONY- Senior Awards will be held on Sunday, **May 19** from **7PM** in the Xavier Theatre. Students are asked to dress up for this formal event. We will present academic and extra-curricular awards as well as several community scholarships. All seniors and their families are welcome to attend, but award recipients will be notifies ahead of the event.

BACCALAUREATE MASS - Baccalaureate Mass will take place on **Tuesday**, **May 21** at **10:50** a.m. in the theatre. Seniors will wear the graduation gowns (but not caps). Family members are welcome to attend.

SENIOR EXAMS - Senior exams will take place on **Thursday, May 23 and Friday, May 24.** Thursday is a full day of school. Seniors will go to their morning classes and then take their third and fourth block exams. On Friday, seniors will take their blocks one and two exams and be finished by 11:35.

GRADUATION PRACTICE—This rehearsal is mandatory for all seniors and will take place at **1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 29** at the Fox Cities

Performing Arts Center. Seniors are asked to enter through the valet parking entrance at the PAC (these are the doors to the right of the main entrance on the corner of Division and College). Practice usually lasts about an hour. Seniors should make sure they are not scheduled to work at this time.

GRADUATION—We will celebrate the Class of 2024 on **Wednesday, May 29 at 7:00 p.m.** (doors open at 6 p.m.) at the Fox Cities Performing Arts Center. Tickets are required for entry. Seniors will receive their 6 VIP tickets oat graduation practice but additional tickets for the upper levels can be picked up from the main office. All guests must have a ticket.

- Create a draft resume of activities, leadership, work, and volunteering
- Consider a summer job or volunteer experience to earn money or learn more about yourself or an occupation that might interest you. Job Shadowing opportunities - check the Xavier counseling <u>website</u>
- Students will receive an unofficial transcript via email in mid-late June to use if visiting colleges over summer

September

- Earliest application deadline is November 1
- · Counselors visit seniors in classes within the first two weeks of school
- Appointments begin to be scheduled for senior one-on-one visits with their counselors
- PLEASE NOTE: Transcript requests will NOT be processed until we are back in school (Sep 1)
