St. Francis Xavier Catholic High School Management of Students With Severe Allergies Plan 2023-2024

In accordance with Wisconsin Law, 2013 Act 239:

- 1. All students with diagnosed food or other severe allergies will report the condition to the school and have an Emergency Care Plan on file at the campus. The Emergency Care Plan will be updated annually unless a change in the student's medical condition necessitates an immediate change.
- 2. All students with food or other severe allergies will have their condition noted in PowerSchool so that teachers and staff are aware. Students whose Emergency Care Plans require unusual protocols or access to specific medication will have the plan shared directly with teachers at the beginning of the school year.
- 3. The St. Francis Xavier Catholic School System provides a hot lunch program at the high school campus. Parents of children with food allergies should contact the food service director with questions or concerns related to allergies.
- 4. Substitute teachers will be given a list of students with Emergency Action Plans and a copy of the plan if unusual protocols or specific medications are required.
- 5. Xavier High School has an Emergency Allergy-Anaphylactic Response Procedure in place. This procedure is reviewed and updated annually.
- 6. Any student or faculty member taunting or harassing a student based on food allergies will be disciplined.
- 7. Teachers and administrators will attend annual training in the recognition of and response to the early signs of allergy-anaphylaxis. All faculty members will be trained in the use of epinephrine auto-injectors.
- 8. Xavier High School will maintain on-site epinephrine auto-injectors for use in the event of an allergy-anaphylaxis emergency. Stock epinephrine will be kept in a tamper-resistant box in two locations.
- 9. This Management of Students with Severe Allergies Plan will be reviewed and updated annually.
