New Grade Point Policies

Before the 2023-24 school year, Xavier graded on a 4.0 scale with a weighted 5.0 scale used for AP and college credit classes. You will see this scale reflected in the first 3 years of our seniors' transcripts.

In 2023-24 a new grade point policy was adopted in order to balance the mental health of our students with the rigor of dual enrollment and Advanced Placement courses. The 5.0 point scale for grading in college credit (AP and dual enrollment) classes was eliminated and an adjustment of the grade scale in those classes allows students to earn a maximum 4.0 credit for achievements of 85% and above.

Our goals for this change are as follows:

- To acknowledge the additional rigor of dual enrollment and college credit classes by providing students more room to learn without being penalized for attempting more complicated material.
- To reduce the pressure on students to take every possible college-credit class in order to maximize a grade point average.
- To encourage students to freely explore areas of interest without fear of a non-weighted course hurting their GPA.
- To allow students the opportunity to try college credit classes without fear of the negative repercussions on grade point average.

Block Schedule

Xavier runs on a block schedule (four 90 minute classes each day) with students taking 8 credits a year in grades 9-11. Seniors may take a minimum of 6 credits.

Policy for Courses Not Offered at Xavier

Xavier students must receive prior administrative approval in order to take a high school course or college credit course that will appear on the Xavier transcript. Approved high school and college courses will be noted on the transcript. Credit may be awarded by Xavier, but the grade will not be calculated in the Xavier GPA.

Christian Service Program

Students are required to perform 80 hours of Christian service before graduation with a minimum of 20 hours completed each school year. The Class of 2023 performed 10,341 service hours!

As part of its Catholic mission, the Xavier community begins and ends each day with a prayer. Mass and prayer services are held weekly. Retreats and opportunities for spiritual growth complement the educational process.

International Students

Xavier will be hosting 11 international students for the 2023-2024 school year. The countries represented are Spain, Vietnam, Kazakhstan, Ukraine, Czech Republic, Slovakia, South Korea, and China.

National Merit Scholars and Kohl Scholarship Recipients

Since 2000, Xavier has had 48 National Merit Scholar Finalists, 51 National Merit Commended Students, and 21 Kohl Scholarship recipients.

Technology

Xavier operates as a 1:1 school. Students are required to bring their own device, typically a laptop computer.

IMPACT OF COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Instruction during the 2020-21 School Year

Instruction occurred in-person at Xavier High School throughout the entire 2020-21 school year, though with a significant modification: our 90 minute block schedule allowed us to split classes with more than 15 students to provide social distancing. Students in split classes received direct instruction in the classroom for half of each block (45 minutes) and worked independently in a study area for the remainder of each block. Grading policies in 2020-21 were consistent with pre-COVID grading policies.
